



Official Rules for the Souper Bowl Chili Cook-Off

1. All ingredients must be pre-cooked & treated prior to the event – Chili is to be brought “ready-to-eat”
2. Contestants are responsible for supplying all of their own utensils & products relating to their chili submission and maintenance of its proper temperature for serving. Spoons and cups for use in serving chili to the general public will be provided. Crackers will also be provided.
3. Each contestant should cook a minimum of four (4) quarts of chili.
4. Each contestant is responsible for policing and cleaning up the area at the end of the day and removing all items from the area.

Judging

Chili will be judged by the parishioners who attend the chili cook-off. When the parishioners pick up their chili cup they will be given a ballot to list their top three favorite chilis. Votes will be tallied as follows:

- 1st place vote will be worth 3 points
- 2nd place vote will be worth 2 points
- 3rd place vote will be worth 1 point

The person with the most overall points will be declared the winner. If there is a tie, the person with the most 1st place votes will be the winner.

Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place.
